

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS SECURITY

Buildings constitute one of the greatest investments of the school district. It is in the best interest of everyone to protect that investment adequately.

Security should mean not only maintenance of a secure (locked) building, but also:

1. minimizing fire hazards;
2. reducing the probability of faulty equipment;
3. guarding against the chance of electrical shock;
4. keeping records and funds in a safe place; and
5. protection against vandalism and burglary.
6. protection of students and employees from acts of violence.

The Safety Coordinator, under the direction of the superintendent, is to establish regulations as may be needed to provide for security in the sense outlined above.
