NONDISCRIMINATION/EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

The Board of Education is committed to a policy of nondiscrimination in relation to race, sex, religion, national background, disability, and other human differences. Respect for the dignity and worth of each individual will be paramount in the establishment of all policies by the Board of Education and in the administration of those policies. The Constitution of our nation and state, pertinent legislation enacted at those two levels of government, as well as court interpretations regarding citizen's rights, undergird this statement.

In keeping with these statements, the following will be objectives of this school district:

1. To promote the rights and responsibilities of all individuals as set forth in the state and federal constitution, pertinent legislation and applicable judicial interpretations.
2. To encourage positive experiences in human values for children and adults who have differing personal and family characteristics and who come from various socioeconomic, racial, and ethnic groups.
3. To carefully consider in all decisions made which affect the schools the potential benefits or adverse consequences that those decisions might have on the human relations aspects of all segments of society.
4. To initiate a process of reviewing all policies and practices of this school district in order to achieve to the greatest extent possible the objectives of this policy.

5. To work toward a more integrated society and to enlist the support of individuals as well of that of groups and agencies, both private and governmental, in such an effort.

The Board of Education's policy on nondiscrimination will be published annually and extend to students, staff, the general public, and individuals with whom the district does business.
