

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

In accordance with state law, all persons over five (5) and under twenty-one (21) years of age and all veterans (except dishonorably discharged veterans) who are residents of the district will be eligible to attend the public schools free of charge, if they have not already received a high school diploma or a GED.

Upon registration, all new students will be required to present:

1. proof of date of birth through a birth certificate or affidavit in lieu of birth certificate.
2. record of immunizations and a health certificate from a licensed physician.
3. proof of residency, if requested.

If any student is under suspension or expulsion in a school district, the student may not enroll in the Todd County School District until the suspension or expulsion has expired. The superintendent or school administrator will prohibit a student from enrolling in the Todd County School District if the student is under suspension or expulsion from a school (public or nonpublic) in another state or from a nonpublic school in this state.

If a high school student enrolls after classes have begun and/or does not have transfer grades they must make up all of the missed work by attending the After-School Tutoring program until such time as the work is completed to ensure their success in fulfilling the requirements for each class.
